The pedestrian gate on ZGL64 Glevum Way, Gloucester Circular Path at Hempsted not far from the River Severn. Tested with recent heavy rain, it's no longer waterlogged. The path has naturally seeded with grass, weeds & herbs and is well walked.



Two years ago there was a quagmire. The drainage ditch was blocked and happy cows churned up glorious mud.

 - lift the gate 150mm,
 - drop a 300mm drainage pipe into the ditch,
 - create a traditional (mixed stone and soil) embanked path over it.

2025 AGM at Churchdown, Saturday 17 January 2026

Gloucester Group kindly hosted the Area AGM. The day began with a climb of Churchdown Hill. Permission had been gained for a tour inside the historic St Bartholomew's church at the summit. Afterwards the walk circled around Chosen Hill before return to St Andrews church hall.

Following a bring-your-own lunch Martin Coles, the Group Chair, gave a brief overview of activities during the year. A number of responses had been made to footpath and planning matters. The walks programme

included both short Wednesday walks and longer weekend walks. Social Activities included a BBQ on Robinswood Hill. Long standing committee Members had retired and new faces stepped forward.



Bernard Gill Secretary and Vice Chair, opened the AGM and thanked the Group for organising the day before running through the Annual Report. Martin Coles temporarily took over while Bernard was elected as Chair before the meeting continued. Michèle Holden was elected as Secretary and Gwen Chaney as Treasurer. Several Members offered to fill vacancies or join in as individual members. Sarah Randell was duly elected as Membership Secretary and Jan van der Lely as Walking Environment Officer.

As they were not standing this year, thanks were given to John Bent-Marshall and Gerry O'Driscoll for many years of service. Affiliated organisations Cheltenham Rambling Club and Stroud Rambling Club would continue to be represented at Area. During the year Cotswold Rambling Club celebrated its 100 Anniversary before agreeing to close. Andy Mudd, Chair of GWG and rep to Area sadly passed away in November. Andy's role in the Group's 25 Anniversary was seen in the June 2025 Member Update.

Members present discussed walk leading, insurance and the structure of Ramblers before the Chair thanked everyone for taking part, and closed the AGM at 2:25 pm.

Janet Gee, Ramblers Trustee, spoke about the challenges of running a large organisation with 106,000 members and proposals for revising governance, organisational structure and size of the Board. There was some discussion of Ramblers role as a respoondee to planning matters. King Charles III Coastal Path is now almost complete thanks to efforts of Ramblers and Natural England.

Some Group Activities

One of 59 Ramblers Areas, Gloucestershire has 8 Ramblers Groups: Cirencester, Forest of Dean, South Cotswold, Gloucester, Cleeve, North Cotswold, Gloucestershire Walking Group with its 20s-30s sub-group.

North Cotswold Ramblers

The Group continued a series of two walks per month through the winter. Some interesting stone pipe manufacturing features were seen near Guiting Power. Other walks included Longborough to Hinchwick, Bourton on the Hill and Sezincote. The traditional November walk around Blockley preceded the AGM which again concluded with Tony's delicious soups. 2026 began with a circuit of the Slaughters. We continue to monitor footpaths and in Spring have arranged a weekend break near Brecon.



Gloucester Ramblers Group

The year has opened with some added variety to the regular walks. We already held a walk in the Forest of Dean exploring the history of mining. A further walk exploring industry in the Forest of Dean is part of the current walk programme, as is an historic tour of the Gloucester docks and a visit to the A417 'missing link' project. Some figure of eight walks that depart twice from the same place, will allow Members who would like a shorter walk to join the second, flat and stile-free loop.

Midweek and weekend walks continue to be well attended and since Christmas have been joined by a number of new walkers. Walk leaders have taken time to view the new guidance and have helped put together another full programme of walks. During these early months of 2026 many have been sodden as shown in the photo.



At the November AGM a number of long-standing and greatly respected members made way for new faces on the committee. We are extremely grateful to Anita King, David McTeer, John Bent-Marshall and Nigel Bone for all their efforts and imagination over the years. They have richly deserved a rest.
